

WaWF GRANTS TIMELINE

OCTOBER

- Priorities are chosen via survey sent to all WaWF members
- Priorities announced at WaWF members' Annual Meeting and are shared publicly soon after
- Collective Grants LOI opens*
- Women & Girls Grant Committee researches orgs; prepares presentations about orgs

FEBRUARY

- Collective Grants Committee reviews LOIs for Collective Grants
- Collective Grants Committee narrows LOIs to 10 per priority (30 total)
- Notification sent to other orgs

APRIL

- Collective Grants Committee has conversations with 15 orgs
- Collective Grants Committee narrows 15 orgs to 6 finalists; \$3,000 grant to each org not moving on

JUNE

- WaWF awards Collective Grants
- WaWF awards Leadership Grants to any finalist who opted-in for it
- Advocacy committee reviews Advocacy Grant orgs

AUGUST

- WaWF awards Advocacy Grants

DECEMBER

SEPTEMBER

- Priorities for this year's themes*** are collected via survey shared with all Convening attendees
- Women & Girls Grant Committee reviews prior year's Women & Girls Grant orgs

NOVEMBER

- PopUP - Women & Girls Grant orgs are presented by committee and voted on by Pop Up attendees

JANUARY

- Collective Grants LOIs deadline

MARCH

- Collective Grants Committee researches 30 orgs; asks confirmation questions as needed
- Collective Grants Committee narrows 30 orgs to 15; \$1,500 grant to each org not moving on

MAY

- All WaWF members vote for 3 orgs (1 per priority)
- All 6 finalist orgs are eligible for restricted Leadership Grant, if desired

JULY

- Advocacy Committee researches orgs

TIMELINE NOTES

* Organizations that work in advocacy or with Women and Girls and that are applying for the Collective Grants are eligible to be considered for the Advocacy Grant and/or Women & Girls Grant by opting-in on the LOI form.

** The Women & Girls Grant will start in Fall 2022.

*** Grant themes rotate biennially. For Year 1 (starting in Fall 2021) will be Law, Justice, and Incarceration; Arts and Community Culture; and Housing and Hunger. For Year 2, the three themes will be Climate and Agricultural Justice; Healthcare; and Education.
