# **Grants to Organizations**

#### Overview

Grants to Organizations (GTO) helps communities nurture and grow the arts. These communities are in rural and urban areas across the state. Our goal is to equitably serve diverse populations.

Our grants focus on cultural equity and the creative economy. They include professional training in the arts. We fund projects, programs, and services spanning artistic disciplines, cultures, and traditions. State and federal funds support our grants.

## In FY 21, GTO programs supported:

- General operating costs. These cover regular operating expenses so arts organizations can focus on programming to benefit the public.
- Art Projects. These grants went to organizations that do not have an arts
  mission, like civic organizations or libraries. The grants support production
  of arts, culture, and heritage experiences that engage the public.
- Art Service Organizations. These grants support professional development services, such as training workshops or technical assistance, to established and emerging arts professionals.
- Pandemic Relief. These grants went to arts organizations to stabilize operations, stimulate hiring and rehiring, and relaunch public programs due to COVID-19 disruptions.
